"For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving, for it is made holy by the word of God and prayer." I Timothy 4:4

2010 LAMP Mission Trip Update Global Outreach Board

The Board of Global Outreach and the group of LAMP volunteers continue to meet monthly to plan and finalize arrangements for the return to Shamattawa and Norway House in July to teach VBS to the First Nation children. We are getting down to "crunch time" for lesson planning, food, snacks, supplies, etc.

We have 22 volunteers this year, a larger group than last year (Praise the Lord!). Since we had additional volunteers, we offered to do an additional VBS program at the Catholic Church in Norway House. They were very receptive to that idea, so we will be coordinating and carrying out three separate VBS programs in Norway House and one in Shamattawa.

Travel arrangements are keeping us flexible, as we have some folks just returning from the National Youth Gathering, unpacking, repacking, and taking off for Canada within a day's timeframe. Since the Shamattawa team needs to catch a flight out of Thompson by 12:15 p.m. on Saturday, July 24, that group plans to leave early Friday morning and stay at Grand Rapids, Manitoba before completing the trip to Thompson on Saturday. The Norway House group will leave on Saturday, July 24 and stay at Grand Rapids before continuing to Norway House on Sunday, July 25. All of us will teach VBS the week of July 26 – 30. Please keep us in prayer during this timeframe, that God will supply wisdom and patience for the volunteers. Also, pray that the hearts and minds of the children will be open and receptive to God's Word as presented through the lessons, music, and in our interactions with the children.

We hope to again be able to update folks through a daily blog on the Trinity website; watch the bulletin for updates regarding that effort.

We wish to thank everyone for their support of this project again this year; it takes the whole body of Christ working together to carry out the Lord's work and no one could do this on their own. May the Lord richly bless our efforts to plant His seed in northern Canada; may the ground be fertile and produce much fruit!

I am very grateful and consider air conditioning a true blessing. As we reflect, we can be thankful for many things we have been blessed with that we did not have in the past.

We can certainly be grateful for the blessing of living in a country of independence and freedom. Independence Day is coming up very soon. Take time that day to thank God for this blessing and to let our law makers know we want Christian morality back in our schools.

July’s National Health Observations are consist of the following:

1. UV Safety Month
2. International Group B Strep Awareness

For your information, since the invention of antibiotics, we do not suffer the effects that Group B Strep used to cause our society.

“How the Lord brought Howard to us”

Recalling our time serving with LAMP in Shamattawa, Manitoba—

On Friday, after VBS and our de-briefing/clean-up of the church, it started to pour rain outside. We waited in the church until it looked like the rain had stopped. As we headed the ¼ mile back to the teacherage, it started to rain again. Along came Howard in his pickup, just coming home from work. He stopped to give us a ride. Sharlene and I hopped in the cab and the rest piled into the back. The first thing Howard told us was that we were all brothers in Christ. He said he was a born-again Christian since 2007, when his 3-yr old daughter died after a truck backed over her. He had earlier also lost a 4-yr old handicapped daughter as well. After the accident happened that killed his 3-yr old, he shared that he was so angry at God, he got in his pickup and drove and drove, crying out to God and asking, “Why?” He finally realized that he could either be bitter for the rest of his life or accept it and try to see what God wanted to teach him through this tragedy.

We invited Howard in to visit when we got to the apartment. We visited, sang and prayed with him. He came back after supper and answered many of the questions we

had about the community, including the many social problems – drug abuse, alcoholism, teen suicides, etc. Howard showed us his Cree hymnal and joined us for devotions and prayer, switching into his native Cree language as he prayed. It was a very powerful, heartfelt and moving experience for us.

Howard shared that he was first led by the Holy Spirit to an evangelist who came to the school gym when he was a young man. At that time, he was an alcoholic and a drug abuser. He heard the Gospel, received Christ, and after time, quit abusing alcohol and drugs. He now ministers to others suffering from alcohol abuse and drugs, relaying his own personal experience. His friend, who almost died six times from sniffing gas, also heard the Gospel that day and is now a pastor.

It is plain to see how God is using Howard to bring the light of Jesus to Shamattawa. We encouraged him to continue this ministry, assuring him that he can have a profound impact with his personal testimony and deep faith.

Howard gave us a ride to the airport on Saturday morning and then went back home to bring his children to say good-bye to us before we left. He gave us pictures of his family as well, so we can keep him and his family in prayer.

I know God delayed us with the rain on Friday, July 24, 2009 so we could meet and be blessed by His servant, Howard.

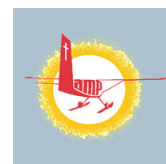

leaving from the church on July 13th at 8:00 am and will be



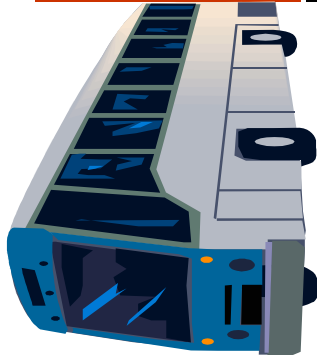
returning to Fergus Falls, on July 23rd, in the afternoon. We will


