From the Pastor's Desk

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

So what travel plans have you made for the summer? Who are you going to visit? What new places are you planning to see? Many of us have made plans to go some where outside of Fergus Falls, during these summer months.

When we travel, rather it be for business or leisure, do we think of ourselves as missionaries? Do we find every opportunity to share our love and faith in Jesus Christ with those we meet, even if we have never met them before? If the answer is no, then the question is why not? The Holy Spirit provides many opportunities to share the saving gospel with others no matter where we go or where we are.

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Class Christianity and the Competition 8 Week Video Series with Dr. Paul L. Maier

The world horizon is littered with competing religions and philosophies. Which has it right? In our multicultural age, we insist on the TRUTH of Christianity. Dr. Maier looks at sacred sources (Biblical documents that are reliable and essentially unchanged over time) and secular sources. We will take a close look at Eastern religions (Hinduism, Buddhism, Confucianism, Shinto, Tao, Judaism, Baha'i, Islam, etc.) and also Western religions (Jehovah Witnesses, Mormons, Scientology, etc.) to see just how they differ from Christianity and what attracts billions around the world to follow these false religions and teachings. The Sunday morning adult Bible class begins at 10:30 am. Everyone is welcomed and encouraged to come. Class begins June 26.

HIPPOS Archaeological Dig Educational Project Support Sunday, June 12, 2011

Kyle Sorkness will be presenting an educational project that he will be working on this summer over in Israel. The location is Hippos of the Decapolis which lies along the Sea of Galilee. When Jesus made reference to a "city on a hill" this was the place He was referring to. Concordia University in St. Paul has been sending a team there for the past ten years. This marks the eleventh year that a group of students, faculty, and students from other Concordia Universities and seminaries and some interested laypeople will be going. Concordia University, St. Paul is in partnership with the University of Haifa together they will work on this archeological dig. The group is primarily digging where there is an ancient church. They will be staying a kibbutz which is a hotel-like building designed for communal living. It's safe and near the location. They will be touring Jerusalem and the Dead Sea. Come and listen to Kyle about what they will be doing each day.

Summer Worship Schedule

Our worship services during the summer months will be offered on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am and Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm. Again, there will be no children's Sunday school but there will be an adult Bible class offered at 10:30 am. The teens are also welcome to join us. 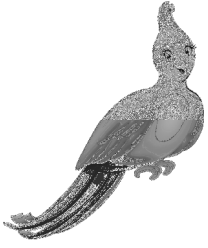


